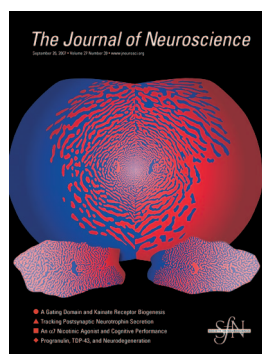


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Cover legend: To achieve binocular vision, information from each eye must be combined in the human brain. Inputs serving each eye are dovetailed together to form a pattern within the primary visual cortex. By unfolding the surface of occipital lobes, Adams et al. have revealed the complete layout of human ocular dominance columns. Patterns from unfolded left and right primary visual cortices of one subject are illustrated (insets at the bottom). The red and blue columns represent the right eye and left eye, respectively. Even the blind spots generated by the optic discs in the eyes are visible within the mosaic of ocular dominance columns. By projecting the primary visual cortex back onto the visual field (shown at the top), it is possible to show the relative amount of visual space served by the columns as a function of distance from the center of gaze. The column pattern shrinks toward the fovea and expands in the periphery. For more information, see the article by Adams et al. in this issue (pages 10391–10403).

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Corrections: In the article “Auditory Spatial Perception Dynamically Realigns with Changing Eye Position” by Babak Razavi, William E. O’Neill, and Gary D. Paige, which appeared on pages 10249–10258 of the September 19, 2007 issue, there were two errors. In the legend for Figure 1, the abbreviation “coord” was incorrectly defined as “coordination.” The last line of the legend should have read as follows: “head coord., Head coordinates; eye coord., eye coordinates.” In addition, Equation 1 was set incorrectly. It should have read as follows:

$$y(t) = y_0 + a(1 - e^{-t/\tau}).$$

In the article “An Energy Budget for the Olfactory Glomerulus” by Janna C. Nawroth, Charles A. Greer, Wei R. Chen, Simon B. Laughlin, and Gordon M. Shepherd, which appeared on pages 9790–9800 of the September 5, 2007 issue, the descriptions of Figure 1, *a* and *b*, were reversed. The legend should have read as follows: Figure 3. Energy demands of the activated glomerulus after electrophysiological stimulation of the olfactory nerve bundle. *a*, Distribution of ATP usage in the glomerulus for an activation of 100% of the ORN axons. *b*, Distribution of ATP usage in the glomerulus for an activation of 1% of the ORN axons.

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
