Copyright Assignment and Experimental Procedures Statement

The Society for Neuroscience ("the Publisher") will be pleased to publish your article ("the Work") tentatively titled:

in *The Journal of Neuroscience*. Publication may occur in print, electronically, or in any other media format, when and if the Work is accepted for publication. The assignment of rights under this agreement shall cover and include all forms of publication and shall include all elements of the article itself as well as figures, tables and supplemental data (if applicable).

1. The undersigned author(s) ("The Author"), or where the Work is a "work made for hire" for an employer ("the Employer"), the Employer, hereby grants and irrevocably assigns to the Publisher, its successors and assigns, all rights to the Work, including those protected by the copyright laws of the United States or any foreign country.
2. The Work, shall include the manuscript and all sub-parts therein, the figures, tables, supplementary data and cover art, if submitted.
3. The Author or, if applicable, the Employer warrants that his/her contribution is original; that he/she has full power to make this grant; that the Work contains no libelous or otherwise unlawful matter; and that either the Work has not been previously published or permission has been obtained for use of the previously published material by the lawful copyright owner. If a portion of the material has been previously published, the Author or the Employer will submit a copy of the permission release as well as language for the appropriate credit lines.
4. The Author shall have the right to reproduce data (figures & tables) and excerpts from the article, provided that permission is first obtained from the Publisher in accordance with its normal guidelines for granting permission to reproduce copyrighted material. In the event that the Author wishes to reproduce the entirety of the article as part of his/her thesis or a similar work, the Author may obtain permission to reproduce the work free of charge, provided that he/she first obtain permission from the Publisher.
5. The Author shall have the right to release the information and deposit the accepted manuscript in any required or requested depository, as indicated by government funding agencies, provided access to the manuscript is granted 6 months after the manuscript has been published in *The Journal of Neuroscience*.

6. The Author shall have the right to deposit the Work (in PDF) as a postprint (in final, published form) in an institutional repository and to post the Work (in PDF) on the author's web page, provided that a link to the Work in *The Journal of Neuroscience* online is provided. Authors must acknowledge The Society for Neuroscience as the copyright holder for the Work.
7. Where the Work is a "work for hire," the Employer (whose authorized agent must also sign below) shall have the right to revise, adapt, prepare derivative works, publish, reprint, reproduce, and distribute the Work provided that all such use is for the promotion of its business enterprise, does not imply the Publisher's endorsement, and lawful notice of the copyright is given.
8. The Publisher, may grant third parties permission to copy all or part of the Work. In the event that the Publisher grants permission for a work to be reprinted in its entirety, he shall request that the third party obtain permission from the Author. Obtaining this permission however shall be the sole obligation of the third party and shall not negate the granting of permission to reproduce, nor shall it give rise to any liability on the part of the Publisher or the third party.
9. Neither Author nor Employer will receive any royalty or other monetary compensation from the Publisher for the rights transferred by this Agreement or for subsequent grants of permission made by the Publisher.
10. If the Work involves research on live vertebrate animals or on human subjects, the Author affirms that the research conforms to the applicable policies and principles for experimental procedures (see the Policy on the Use of Animals in Neuroscience Research and the Policy of Human Subjects, found at <http://web.sfn.org/content/Publications/HandbookfortheUseofAnimalsinNeuroscienceResearch/Policy.htm>
11. All authors have read and agreed to abide by the guidelines on Responsible Conduct Regarding Scientific Communication (which can be found at the following url: <http://www.sfn.org/content/AboutSfNI/Guidelines/guidelines.htm>), specifically, but not limited to including terms relating to authorship, conflict of interest, and making available to qualified scientists for bona fide research purposes all materials that were used in the reported research and are not otherwise readily available. This includes propagatable research materials (such as monoclonal antibodies, transgenic mice, and DNA probes and constructs) and, where possible, non-propagatable materials (for example, serum antibodies).
12. The Author agrees that the Publisher's publication fee is \$750 per regular article and \$375 per Brief Communication. No waivers for this charge will be granted except in cases of extreme financial hardship which shall be determined by the publisher. The price for all work requiring special printing, including figures in color, will be determined by the Publisher. The Author will be invoiced for such work by the Publisher and agrees to pay said charges within 30 days from the date of the receipt of the invoice.

13. The Author further warrants that he/she will protect, indemnify and hold harmless the Publisher from any and all claims, actions, suits, damages, and liabilities, arising from a breach of this Agreement or any warranties, obligations or representations set forth herein, that the Author knowingly or negligently commits.
14. The Parties consent and agree that this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the District of Columbia and that all legal proceedings related to the subject matter herein shall be brought and maintained in the courts of the District of Columbia.

_____(check if applicable) 15. Does this work report any new genomic or cDNA sequences? If so, the sequence accession number in a data base generally accessible to the neuroscience community should be provided at the time the Work is sent to press.

This Agreement must be signed by all authors, or in the case of a “work made for hire,” by an authorized agent of the employer. The Work shall not be processed for publication until all necessary parties have signed the agreement.
