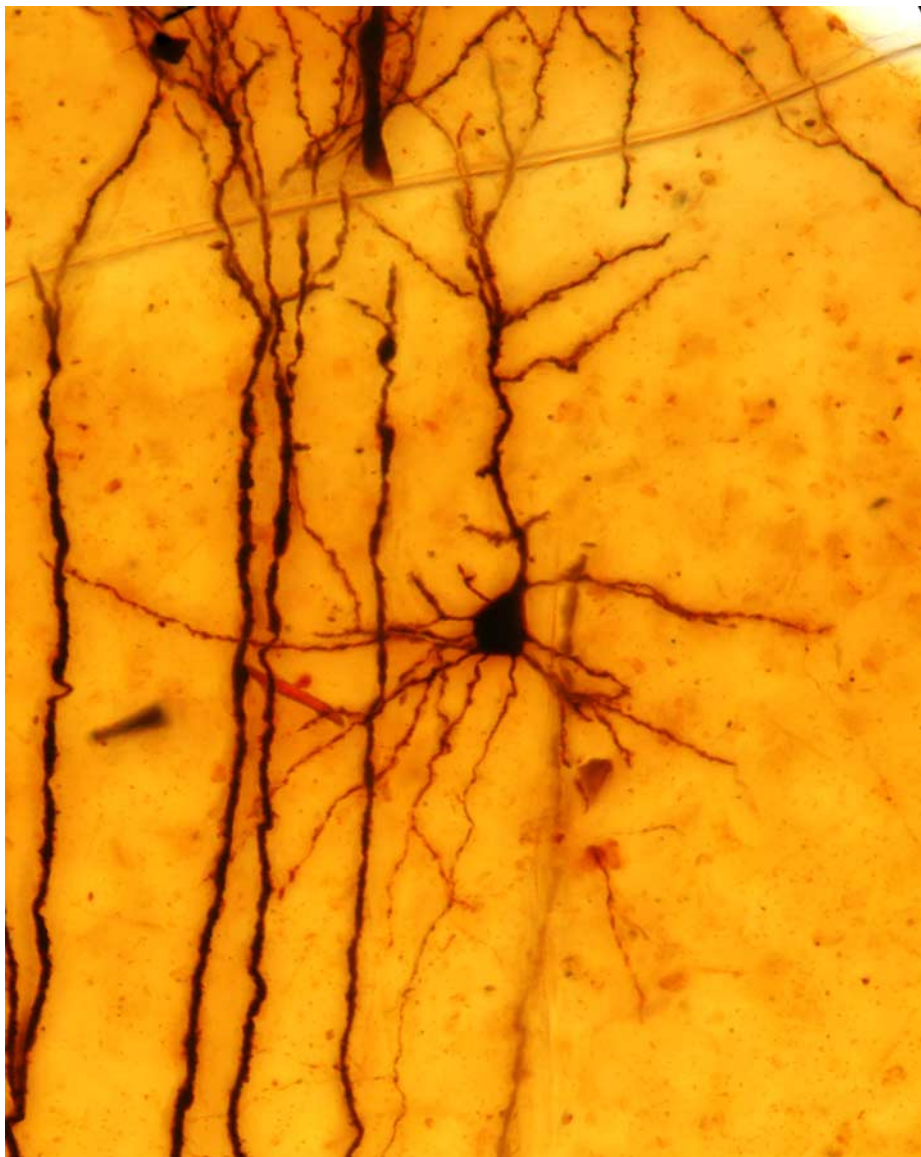
A Note of Appreciation for Reviewers and Editors
